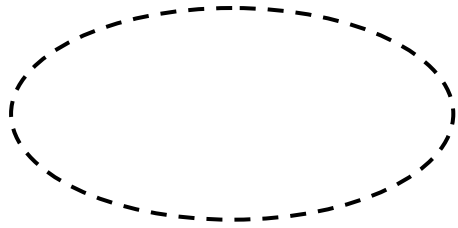


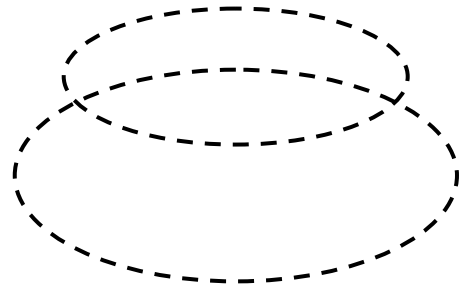
DRAW YOUR OWN SNAIL!

All you will need is: paper, a pencil, a felt tip pen, a rubber and colouring pencils.

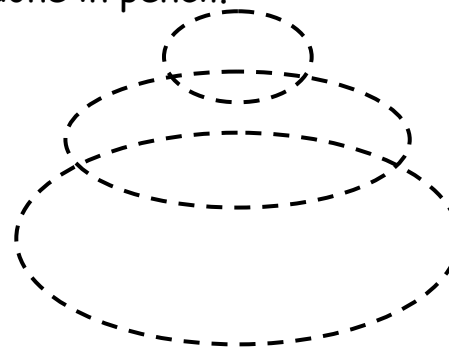
Steps 1 - 7 can be traced or drawn freehand and **MUST** be done in pencil.



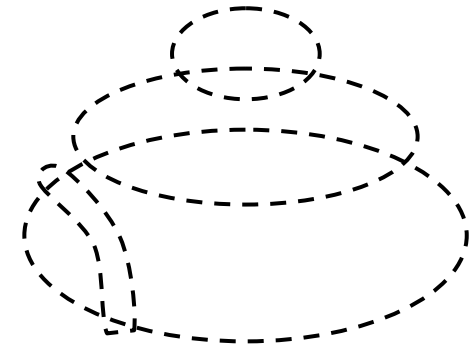
1. Draw an oval (the 'body whorl' of the shell)



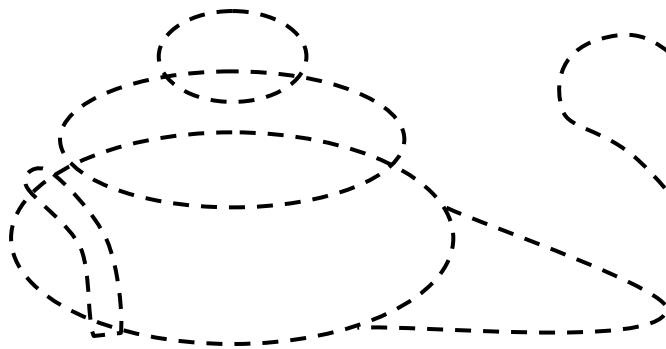
2. Draw a smaller oval overlapping the first one (another 'whorl' of the shell)



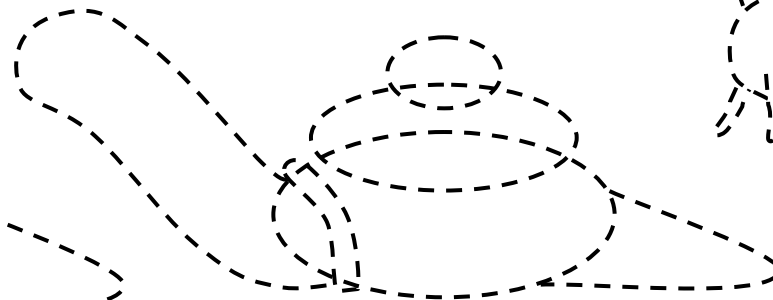
3. Draw one more small oval just above the second one (the 'apex' of the shell)



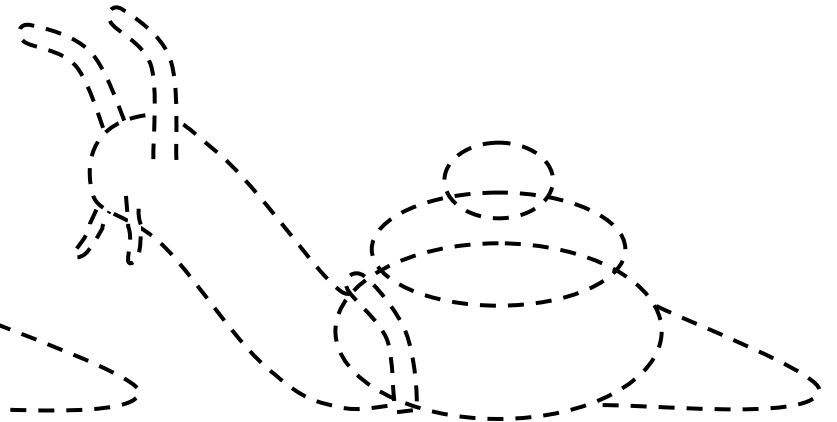
4. Draw the lip of the shell



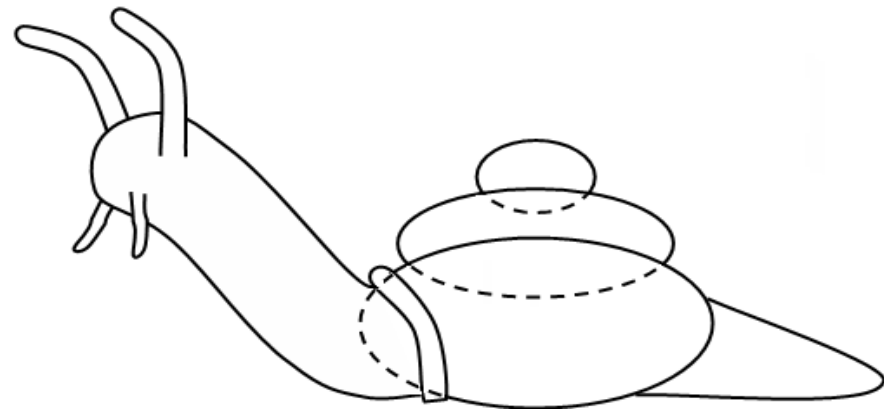
5. Draw the 'foot' of the snail



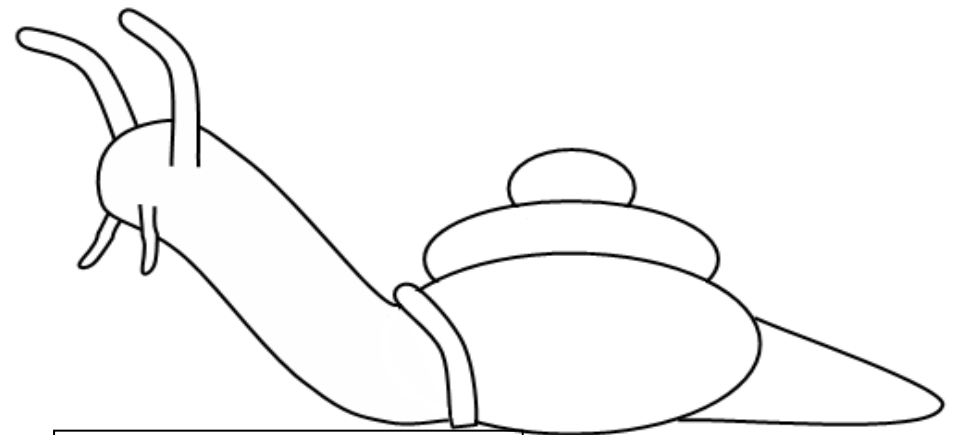
6. Draw the rest of the snail's body and head



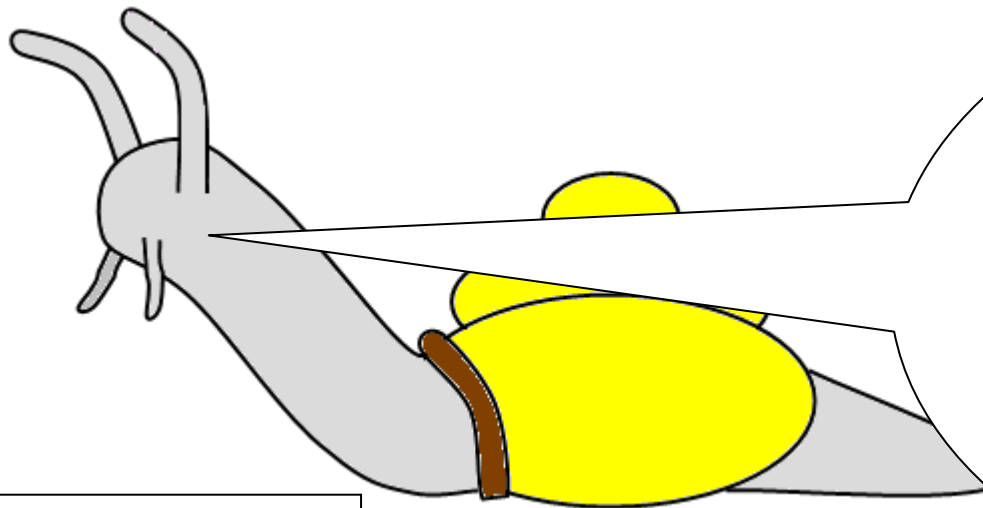
7. Add four tentacles to the head (the top two are eye-stalks and the bottom two are for detecting chemicals)



8. Go over the pencil lines with a marker pen. The dotted lines in this picture should stay in pencil.



9. Rub out the pencil lines



10. Colour your snail in!

Top hints on how to colour me in!

Decide which species you want your snail to be. If it is *Cepaea nemoralis*, it will have a brown lip and if it is *Cepaea hortensis* it will have a white lip.

The shell colour can either be yellow, pink or brown.

The banding pattern can be one-banded (across the middle), many banded (up to five) or unbanded (no bands at all).

The body colour can be light or dark grey, with a hint of light green.
